They would like strong leadership to ensure that we are able to secure global net zero by 2050 and to stay on course for 1.5 degrees of global warming. Commit to developing a Climate Action Plan at both a local and national level

In particular they would like plans to

- Provide integrated public transport with affordable and simple ticketing .
- Prioritise pedestrians and cyclists.
- Encourage the maintenance and creation of green spaces.
- Divest public money from fossil fuel and invest in the green economy.

We have had plans and targets in the past and they have not been met but there is no more time to delay if we are to secure the future of the planet for our children and grandchildren.

Members have indeed taken up the the challenge to become more sustainable.

Some guilds have worked together towards this goal and have got together to recycle items such as crisp packets and medicine blister packs.

While others such as Sedgley Evening Guild ran a Save the Bees campaign. This involved leaving crochet bees around town, and making Post Box toppers to increase awareness of the problem. Members have been getting involved , by making pledges towards a more sustainable lifestyle.

In the run up to COP 26 we have had a Take a Leaf Out of Our Book initiative, encouraging members to make a pledge online or to craft a leaf and send it to Headquarters.

Individual members and the TG national organisation have worked with other organisations and supported their initiatives such as the Climate Coalition, WRAP, Count us In and the governments consultation on a deposit return scheme
